This year the Science Festival opened its doors on Thursday 24 October and the following day all classes from MYP1 to MYP3 participated in workshops, exhibitions and conferences on various themes.

MYP1

The students of the RED class participated in the workshop 'Mi ingegno per la salute' and the interactive exhibition 'Scienze della Vita', at the School of Robotics. After lunch, they headed to Palazzo Reale for the interactive workshop 'La vita segreta degli oggetti' between energy, technology and engineering.

The GREENs took part in 'Colori in movimento - Viaggio nel mondo delle combinazioni del Cubo di Rubik', a hands-on workshop of mathematics, logic and computer science, while in the afternoon they reflected on the possibility turning sea water into drinking water, during the workshop 'Un mare d'acqua. I segreti dell'acqua e il mare come risorsa potabile' in Piazza delle Feste.



MYP2

Both classes took part in the human sciences and philosophy laboratory 'Nanoscopica' at the University Library and 'Stella sulla Terra' a Physics and matter installation at Palazzo Reale. After lunch, the Greens went to Porto Antico to participate in a workshop that combined chemistry and history entitled 'Per fortuna Marco Polo era curioso!' while the Reds went to the De Amicis Library for the laboratory 'A ritmo di Legumi'.



MYP3

MYP3 Green students participated in 'Salumi challenge - Il gusto della sfida' an interactive seminar of Agriculture and food Sciences and in 'The secret life of objects', while MYP3 RED in 'Real treasures, virtual treasures' an interesting laboratory on human sciences, art, philosophy and history of science. In the afternoon they saw the multimedia exhibition 'Earth, Sea and Environmental Sciences' at Palazzo Ducale.



On Saturday 12th October, DIS Primary students participated in a series of activities to reflect on which languages they know, can communicate in and are learning.

PYP1 AND PYP2

Primary 1 and Primary 2 came together in a single class and searched for animals to build the IB Learner Profile. The teachers showed various types of animals, and then the children voted by a show of hands. The animal with the most votes won. The animals available for voting shared the same characteristics as those of the Learner Profile, and the children chose the one they liked best. In this unit, we are focusing on two characteristics and have chosen two special animals:

- for Communicator we chose the dolphin, because it communicates with its companions through waves
- for Caring we chose a koala, because it takes care of its cub by carrying it on its back.

In relation to the unit, fifth graders held a debate discussing their electoral proposals, surprising me in some cases with their proposals and the depth of some of their electoral promises!



MYP2 - PODCAST

To raise awareness for the UNESCO World Prevention of Poverty Day on 17th October 2024, MYP2 Red students worked in groups to produce some podcasts for the DIS podcast.



MYP4 - DEBATE

Students are learning about the most important conflicts and peace efforts in the history of humanity. At the end of each lesson, each of these conflicts and peace efforts teaches us something about current politics. In particular, when studying the Battle of Adrianople, students learn about the immigration issues of the Roman Empire, and we try to link them with immigration policies today. Students were asked to do a debate on *Ius Soli* against *Ius Sanguinis*.

MYP5 - MEETS THE “NEW” LIBRARY

"In October, both MYP5 classes launched the Library's updated lending service, now featuring an online catalogue and a platform for consulting, booking, and renewing book loans. 


DP ACTIVITIES - Focus on CAS

This month we want to tell you about the experiences and reflections of two DP2 students, Sofia in Genoa and Mattia in Rapallo, who have long been involved in Service activities at two voluntary associations dedicated to ambulance transport and rescue.


"I am Sofia Betsos, I'm 17 years old and a student from DP2. For one of my CAS activities, I chose to volunteer at the Croce Bianca Genovese, in Piazza Palermo. I started going there in February 2024. Before starting the journey I had a meeting with the director of Croce Bianca, Massimo, the purpose was to make sure that I knew about the task and the commitment I was going to make. I go there around 2-3 times a week for more or less two hours. I'm really passionate and learn a lot from it, especially from the volunteers with whom we worked on the ambulances. My mates and I assisted a lot of elders, for instance we took them to and from their houses to the hospital. I strongly recommend to kids my age to join the Croce Bianca Genovese, or an organization such as this one since it shows how much people that work in that environment help others and how much effort it takes".

"I'm Mattia den Hollander and have been going to the Croce Biance in Rapallo. The first few times I did simple tasks, but as I got to know more volunteers and joined Squadra 3, I took on more diverse roles, like delivering test tubes and blood to the "San Martino" hospital. Though I couldn't go in the ambulance, it was still a great experience that showed me the value of teamwork and volunteering. I strongly recommend this service activity, even if you don't live in Genoa, but smaller cities like I do."
