Women's day

Many countries organize events and protests to sensibilise the equality between the two genders. Also, in schools, this day represents an opportunity to educate students and work on inclusion, setting the basis for a better future and a fairer society. The 8th of March shouldn't only be a celebration, but also a constant effort of people in a way that women's role in society will be recognized more and more, both in Italy and also around the world.



"Volevo Essere un Duro"

After the end of the 75th Sanremo Festival, the Italian music fest, everyone started talking about different singers and their sensational performances, arguing about who really deserved the victory; but an incredible new discovery emerged during the festival, bringing to the competition a completely different song from the others, carrying a message that was able to enter the hearts of millions of Italians, as well as the singer-songwriter himself. His name is Lucio Corsi.

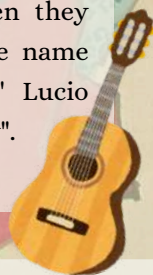


In "Volevo essere un duro" (*I wanted to be tough*) the protagonist dreams of being someone who is not afraid of anything, who faces life like a robot or a warrior, without worrying about the future. But as the song goes on, he starts realizing that this is not how life works: he is not a "tough guy", he is just a normal person, with fears and insecurities. In the last verse of the song Lucio finally accepts himself for who he actually is, without trying to change or become someone else. The song is about learning to live with your fears, without trying to escape from them. The lyrics are about personal growth where the individual accepts the person he is, without trying to become someone that doesn't represent him.

We must learn to appreciate people like Lucio, who do not always convey the same commercial ideas to us, but instead something new, humble and unique. The talent and creativity of this artist reaches levels that we can barely imagine: Able to play three different instruments (piano, guitar and harmonica) he decides to include them in the same song, showing all his



abilities. The only one not to lip-sync at the "Dopo Sanremo", he performed with Topo Gigio at the cover night and when they asked him "Why did you write the name Andy on the sole of your shoe?" Lucio replied "Because I'm Andy's property".

WICKED



I think we all know and maybe saw the famous movie *Wicked* that came out in November 2024. You probably heard of this movie thanks to the international popstar Ariana Grande, and maybe you have the most popular song “Defying Gravity” in your playlist due to Cynthia Erivo’s trend performance on Tik Tok. But did you know that *Wicked* is actually one of the most extraordinary shows of the musical theatre? Composed by Stephen Schwartz, *Wicked* made its debut in Broadway in 2003, becoming a huge commercial success, being

nomined for ten Tony Awards and winning three of them. It became the fourth longest running Broadway show, behind *The Phantom of the Opera*, the 1996 revival of *Chicago*, and *The Lion King*. In 2006, *Wicked* finally made its debut in London West End with Idina Menzel as Elphaba. After years and thousands of performances in the theatre of the whole world, the decision of making a *Wicked* movie is taken. The producers chose to include Ariana Grande and Cynthia Erivo, making the Broadway musical one of the most famous and known shows of all times.

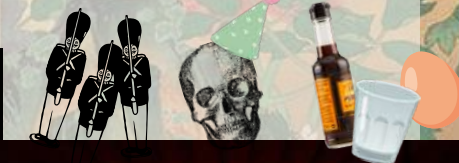

Cooking with Teachers

Walnut sauce with Prof. Rondanina

Ingredients for 6 people:

- approx. 10 walnuts
- parmesan cheese (grated)
- enough to fill a cup
- ground nutmeg - enough
to see it and taste it...
- 1 or 1/2 garlic clove
- extra-virgin olive oil -
(approx. 4 tablespoons)
- a pinch of salt



The secret to the success of this recipe is to roughly (a occhio) follow the procedure to then develop your own version.

1. In a blender, blend the walnuts together with the garlic clove.

2. Pour the blended mixture into a large cup and add the parmesan, ground nutmeg, salt and oil.

3. Stir until you obtain a smooth texture

Version 2

Same as above but you can add the soft part of 1 bread roll (without the crust) and three tablespoons of milk

SERVING TIP: for a tastier experience, add some of the water used to cook the pasta or pansotti to the sauce before mixing this into the pasta!

Nowruz



Also known as the Iranian/Persian New Year, Nowruz celebrates the spring equinox and the start of the new year on the Iranian calendar. It is celebrated by visiting family, buying flowers and a house cleaning, as well as buying new clothes. Food is also prepared, but so is a Haft-sin, which is a table with 7 traditional items and foods starting with the letter S, as pictured in the image on the right.



Hanami

Hanami (花見), literally meaning flower watching, is the yearly Japanese custom from the end March to early May dedicated to watching the flower trees (almost always cherry blossoms, but occasionally plum trees) grow into full bloom. Yearly, a blossom forecast is made by the Japan Meteorological Agency where the "cherry blossom front" is announced, which predicts of the gradual growth of the cherry blossoms throughout Japan. Hanami is usually celebrated by having picnics and other outdoor activities under the blossoming flower trees.



Holi

Holi is the Hindu festival of colours, love, and spring. It celebrates the arrival of spring in India, the end of winter, and the blossoming of love, as well as the wish for a good spring harvest. It celebrates the eternal and divine love of the deities Radha and Krishna, as well as the triumph of good over evil. Children and youth celebrate by throwing coloured powder and water at each other, while adults smear dry coloured powder on each other's faces.

Bigflo et Oli - Rentrez chez vous: un message contre le racisme et les préjugés

Connaissez-vous des chansons françaises célèbres ? Et surtout, savez-vous ce que cela signifie ? Aujourd'hui, vous allez découvrir la signification de la chanson "Rentrez chez vous" composée par Bigflo et Oli.

Bigflo & Oli lancent un message direct et provocateur contre les propos racistes avec leur titre "Vous nous dites de rentrer chez nous, mais nous, on est déjà chez nous". Les rappeurs retournent le discours souvent adressé à des personnes issues de minorités, affirmant qu'ils sont déjà chez eux, peu importe leur origine, culture ou couleur de peau. Le morceau rappelle que tout le monde a sa place dans la société, et rejette toute forme de discrimination.

Le clip de Bigflo & Oli est soigneusement réalisé pour renforcer le message de la chanson. Les rappeurs ont étudié chaque aspect visuel, car ils estiment que les images ajoutent de la profondeur au sens des paroles.

Dans le clip, vous pouvez voir les deux rappeurs démontrer physiquement cette scène. Tout commence avec la Tour Eiffel détruite et continue avec Oli qui s'enfuit en représentant les réfugiés. Si vous écoutez attentivement, vous pouvez entendre Bigflo dire : « Ça fait 4 jours que j'ai pas d'nouvelles d'Oli », ce qui signifie qu'il n'a aucune nouvelle de son frère, de son sang, de sa famille, car il doit survivre. En regardant la vidéo, je me suis demandé : « Est-ce normal de vivre comme ça ? » Ne pas savoir si son frère est vivant ou mort, ne pas savoir quoi faire de sa vie, voilà ce qui s'est passé. Et voilà l'histoire.

Et vous, auriez-vous imaginé qu'une chanson puisse avoir autant de pouvoir sur la société et une signification aussi profonde ? Je n'aurais jamais imaginé cela avant de l'étudier dans la classe de français du MYP5. Vous connaissez désormais une nouvelle façon de lutter pour ce en quoi vous croyez et pour votre société: la musique.

Gaël Faye

Petit pays, une chanson mais aussi un livre

Gaël Faye est né au Burundi en 1982, en tant que fils d'une mère rwandaise et un père français. Il a vécu une adolescence tranquille, pleine de journées passées avec ses amis dans la campagne burundaise. Mais un jour tout a changé. Gaël Faye avait 13 ans quand la guerre civile entre les deux principaux groupes ethniques du Rwanda, les Hutus et les Tutsis, a commencé. La guerre dure 100 jours, se déroule d'avril à juillet 1994. Ce sont trois mois terribles. La population hutue massacre la minorité tutsie et quiconque s'oppose à eux, et à la fin des guerres plus de 800 000 civils sont morts et 2 000 000 de Rwandais ont fui le pays. Parmi eux se trouvait la famille de Gaël Faye. En effet, ils fuient le pays pour aller en France. Ici Faye découvre le monde de la musique, en particulier celui du rap et du hip hop. Pour lui la musique est un exutoire, et il commence à écrire des chansons. A travers l'écriture de ces chansons et de la création de son premier album "Pili Pili", Gaël Faye découvre qu'il peut parler au public de la réalité du génocide. Cela se voit clairement dans sa chanson Petit Pays. Dans cette chanson Faye parle de l'amour pour ses origines et son pays. Il parle de ses souvenirs d'enfance avant la guerre et comment le génocide a renversé cette situation de paix. Mais Faye ne perd pas l'espoir qu'un jour son pays puisse à nouveau briller.

La chanson traite de thèmes délicats comme la guerre et pour cette raison elle a conquis le cœur de nombreuses personnes. Ça a permis à Gaël Faye de continuer à écrire et raconter l'histoire de la réalité du génocide. En fait, en 2016 il écrit un livre. Le livre s'appelle aussi Petit Pays et en peu de temps il devient un des livres les plus lus en France, remportant divers prix comme celui du Prix Goncourt des lycéens et du Prix du roman Fnac. Je vous invite à aller découvrir cette merveilleuse chanson.

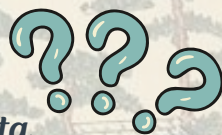
